Re: Campaigning on U of T campuses

As an institution of higher learning, the University of Toronto is pleased to help facilitate student engagement in the electoral process. As a publicly-supported institution, the University neither supports nor endorses any particular candidate or party at any level of government.

The University recognizes that an important element of political campaigns is the ability of candidates to canvass voters in their constituency. With regard to canvassing in student residences on campus, the University will comply with the <u>relevant law</u> and foster engagement, while concurrently respecting the health and safety and privacy of the students living in residence.

### **Access to University Residences and Dormitories**

Candidates and their designates will be required to contact the residence administrators (see attached table), who will assist in arranging reasonable access to common areas at an agreed upon time. While door-to-door access will be permitted in apartment-style and townhouse residences, we request that the candidates contact residence administrators to coordinate timing.

#### **Additional Guidelines**

Consistent with our status as a non-partisan, public institution, we would like to remind candidates and their representatives of a few additional guidelines:

- No images with U of T branding or senior University leadership should be used for any purposes during a campaign period.
- Election signage may not be posted on University property, the exception to this rule is within a student's residence room.

- Campus space inquiries will be considered based on University policies and availability as would be the case for any other external group. <u>Campus Events</u> can be contacted at <u>campusevents@utoronto.ca</u>
- The University's logo or signage may not be used at election-related events, including virtual
  events. For additional background, please see the University's <u>policy</u> and procedure on the
  temporary use of space.
- Filming on campus requires approval of the University in advance.
